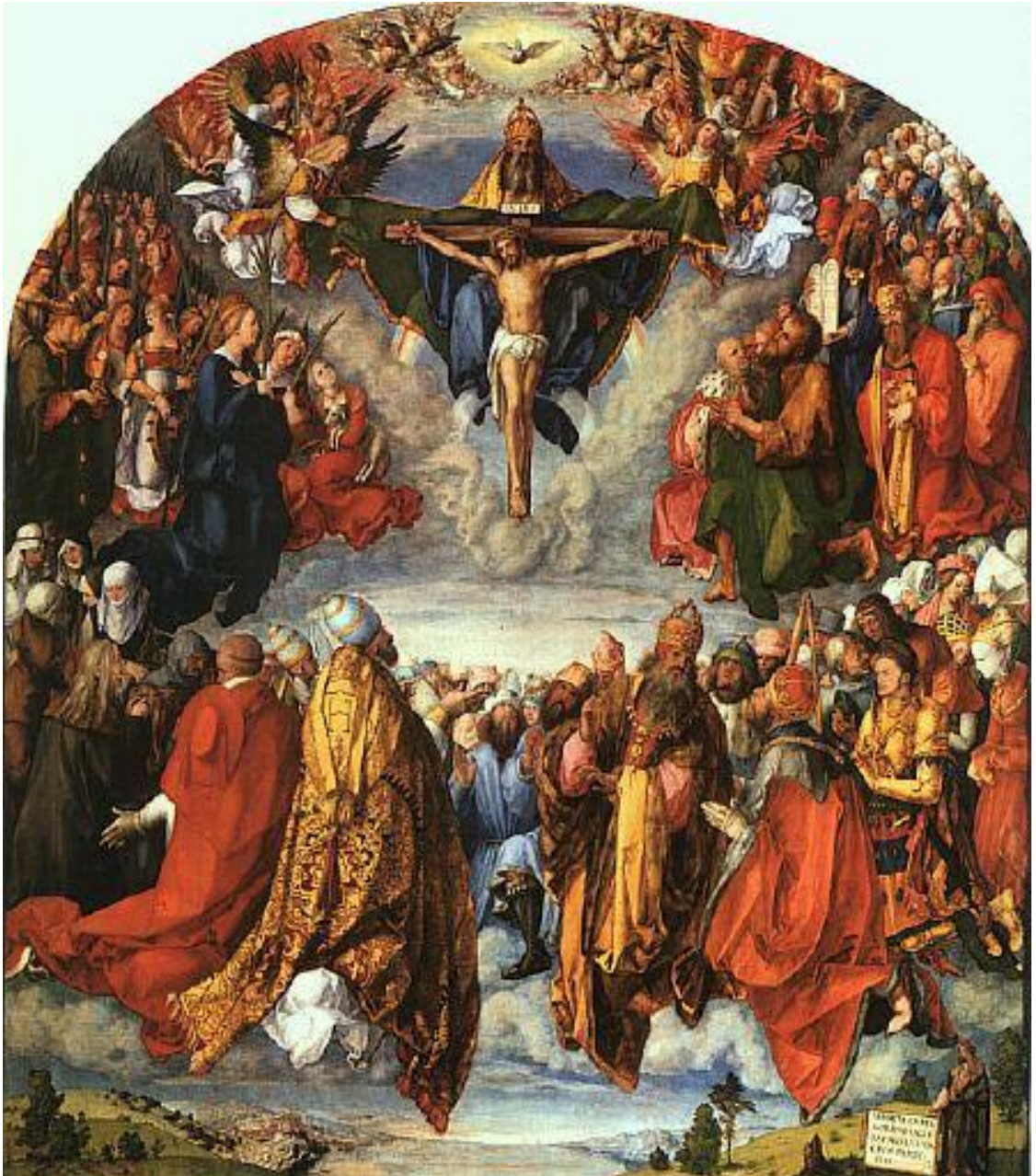


***JOINING THE SAINTS IN HEAVEN -

Because we will be celebrating Holy Communion during today's service, we encourage all of our visitors to prayerfully review our communion practice, which is listed below.

Holy Communion And Fellowship In The Christian Faith

The Lord's Supper is the true body and blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ, under the bread and wine, given by Christ Himself, for us Christians to eat and to drink, for the forgiveness of our sins. This "real presence" of Christ is not "make believe". Although we cannot fully comprehend it; nevertheless, Jesus said "*This IS My Body given for you.....This IS My Blood shed for you.*" However, because we are truly receiving the very body and blood of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, God's Word also teaches us that the Lord's Supper can actually be taken to one's harm: if one does not believe that in the supper we receive the true body and blood of Jesus Christ (see I Corinthians 11:27-32), or if one is not repentant of their sins, or if one does not truly understand what the Lord's Supper is and what it gives.

Furthermore, Holy Communion is also the most intimate expression of our oneness in Christ, and of our unity in the Christian faith on this side of heaven. Therefore, out of love for our guests, if you are not a member of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, we would humbly ask that you not commune with us yet, until you have had an opportunity to join us for a study of the Christian faith. We do this so that no one takes the Lord's Supper wrongly, to their harm. And we also do this as we strive to uphold true unity in the Christian faith, in all that God's Word teaches us.

However, guests are always welcome to come to the communion rail, bow their heads and fold their hands as the bread and the wine are passed, to receive a prayer of blessing from our Pastor.

The Organ Preludes

The Opening Prayer

(Please Rise.)

Pastor: Blessed are all Thy saints, O God and King, who have traveled over the tempestuous sea of this life, and have made it safely to Thy heavenly harbor of peace and life, where there is no more night or darkness, suffering or death.

Watch over us who are still on our dangerous voyage, and remember all who lie exposed to the rough storms of sin, trouble, and temptation; for frail is our vessel, and the ocean is wide. But as in Thy mercy Thou hast set our course heavenward, through Jesus Christ, our Savior, so steer the vessel of our life, toward Thy everlasting shore of peace. Then bring us at last, we pray, to the quiet haven of our heart's desire; to live with Thee, where Thou, O God, art ever blessed, and where Thou livest and reignest with all Thy saints and angels forevermore. Amen.
(A Prayer of St. Augustine, adapted.)

During the Invocation, the sign of the cross may be made by all in remembrance of their baptism.

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The Confession Of Sins

ALL: Merciful Father, we have erred and strayed from Your holy ways. Many times we have willingly lost the way home to heaven – Jesus Christ, our Savior. We have followed too much the desires of our own hearts. We have done those things which we ought not to have done. We have not done those things which You asked of us; and there is no health or life in us. Have mercy on us, O God. Spare all who confess their sins; and restore all who are repentant. We have nowhere else to turn, O Lord, but to Your grace to us in Christ – for upon Him You laid the iniquities of us all; and by His stripes, we are healed. For His sake, grant us Your forgiveness, and grant that we may live Godly lives, to the honor and praise of Christ’s Holy Name, until we live with You in heaven.

The Lord’s Absolution

Pastor: Jesus Christ has conquered death, and brought life and immortality to life through the Good News of His forgiving death, and His victorious resurrection. He assures all who confess their sins: “There is now NO condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus!” Not only has His wrath been removed from you, but His never-ending life has been given to you, as He promises us, “I am the Resurrection and the Life, he who believes in Me, will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in Me will never die eternally.” Therefore, in the stead, and by the command of Jesus, I say to you, “Be of Good Cheer! Your sins are forgiven, in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen! Thanks be to God!

The Salutation and Collect of the Day

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

ALL: And also with you.

Pastor: Let us pray. Heavenly Father, Whose people are knit together in Your One, Holy, Christian Church – the Body of Christ. Grant us Your grace to follow Your blessed saints, in faith and sweet service to our Savior, Jesus Christ. Grant that we may be found faithful, even unto death, that we may receive the crown of everlasting life in Heaven; and there to know fully, the inexpressible joys which You have prepared for all those who love You; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, Who lives and reigns with You, and the Holy Spirit, One God, now and forever.

ALL: Amen!

The First Lesson

Revelation 7:9-17

⁹ After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands.

¹⁰ And they cried out in a loud voice:

“Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb.”

¹¹ All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, ¹² saying:

“Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!”

¹³ Then one of the elders asked me, “These in white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?”

¹⁴ I answered, “Sir, you know.”

And he said, “These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb.

¹⁵ Therefore, “they are before the throne of God
and serve him day and night in his temple;
and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence.
¹⁶ ‘Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst.
Never again will the sun beat upon them with scorching heat.’^[a]
¹⁷ For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd;
‘he will lead them to springs of living water.’^[b]
‘And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.’^[c]”

The Prayers Of The Church

(Please Rise.)

Pastor: Let us pray for the whole people of God, and for all people according to their needs. O Lord, support us all the day long of this troubled life, until the shadows lengthen and the evening comes, when this busy world is hushed, the fever and suffering of this life is over, and our work is done. Then Lord, in Your mercy, grant us a blessed death, a safe lodging, a home in heaven, and peace at last, through Jesus, our Savior.

ALL: “Jesus said, ‘I am the resurrection and the life, whoever believes in Me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in Me will never, ever die.’

Pastor: We remember those who, together with us, stood at the foot of the cross, who were baptized into Christ’s forgiving death and victorious resurrection, who heard the the Easter truths of the empty tomb of Christ: ‘Do not be afraid! He is risen from the dead, just as He said!’; and who shared in the supper of our Risen Savior. And we rejoice with those who have gone before us into the mansions of Heaven.

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

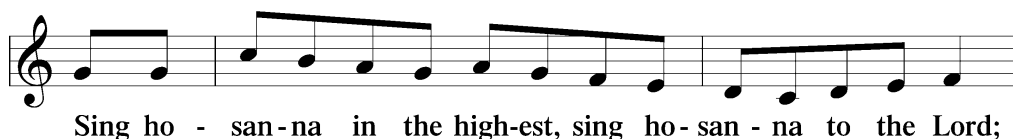
ALL: And also with you.
